DELEGATION

Brian Hillaby, General Manager, Grande Spirit Foundation and Terry Longson, Housing Manager for Sexsmith, LaGlace, Wembley, and Beaverlodge

The Foundation has had difficulty filling the vacancies at Sunset Homes. They have six single family houses in Sexsmith. One is empty right now but will be filled on the 15th. Families with no children are not entitled to live in family housing. Grande Spirit Foundation has tried to encourage the province to sell of houses in Sexsmith. Rent includes gas and water. Requirements for housing are based on total household gross revenue.

There are 38 people on the list for Sunset Homes. Some are under 60 years of age. They could even be working and get a residence. Rent would be 30% of gross pay to a maximum amount. Twenty-four calls were made to fill four vacancies. Some were not ready to move in or could not leave their pets. Some had to sell the farm before they moved.

Membership in the Grande Spirit Foundation comprised of the five largest assessed communities, plus Spirit River and the two elected in November. There are two meetings yearly that involve all members. Other meetings are considered more operational and they don't need the 12 members on the board.

The board does not have a long-term plan. Plans are developed according to their wait list.

Mr. Hillaby is not sure of funding for seniors' housing project. June 18th, 2010 is the next full meeting and there will be an annual financial report at that meeting.

Councillor Siggelkow asked if the board meetings are open to the public.

Mr. Hillaby replied that they are but they wouldn't have a vote but are certainly welcome to build relationships.

DELEGATION

Linda Beaudet, Principal, St. Mary's School

Ms. Beaudet gave an overview of program to be set up at St. Mary's school. They talked to parents and the thought is to start a pre-kindergarten program. The kinder care would be available on off kindergarten days. Ms. Beaudet believes that the sooner you start education, the better. The after school program will be for grades 1 to 6. They are trying to hire a private company to run the program. She is expecting the program to grow over time. They have about ten pre-registered. The program will hold 20 to 25 children. If they can't find a provider, they maybe will run the program with teaching assistant. They want the program to start in September. They had twenty-one students enrolled in kindergarten last year and have twenty-three registered for the coming year. They will allow non-Catholic participants. They do not have costs for the service set up yet.
