DELEGATION

Bernd Manz, Doug Anderson, Aquatera

Council questioned Bylaw 848, the Aquatera Bylaw for services, and Mr. Manz answered that the bylaw is mainly limiting the materials to go through the sewage systems. Aquatera wants industry to be aware of what they can put down the sewer and to inform on how to maintain their sumps. All three municipalities have the same bylaw.

On Unanimous Shareholders Agreement, they are down to discussion on how new assets are transferred in. Before new assets are transferred in, profits (retained earnings) are to be changed into preferred shares added to existing shares. Over a long period of time, the percentages may change a little.

Mr. Anderson went over scenarios and he thinks that the County are now in favour. With voting shares, all decisions must be unanimous.

Cash investment would continue to receive Class "D" (5% dividend forever). No strings attached to cash investment, and no provision to designate cash to specific project. Two year waiting period for cash investments. If partners now transfer assets, Aquatera is not obliged to give dividends.

Stock dividends on new assets may not be cash dividends but be in shares.

Councillor Siggelkow asked who was on the board. Mr. Manz stated that the new move is to try to get board members who are not on Councils. All members must be voted in unanimously.

A nine-member board, possibly one elected official from each municipality and six public members, with one being the chair is being considered.

Regarding Recycle Plus, the task force is comprised of Aquatera, County, City, and North Peace area of B.C. There are no handicapped people working at the facility. Profits are distributed to the Society for the Handicapped.

Councillor Siggelkow asked if offsite levies (connection fees) are in line with other municipalities?

Mr. Manz said they will review it. It is used to fund the cost of growth.
