DELEGATION Trevor Matkowski, InfoTech

Trevor Matkowski spoke and gave the pros and cons of various types of tablets and presented IPad II. Mr. Matkowski said the tablet will not replace a computer. Hundreds of thousands of programs are available for the IPad. There is no end of accessories for IPads. Mr. Matkowski said the IPad will stand up to quite a lot of abuse. He showed camera capability of the IPads and displayed a leather folder that he would recommend for an IPad. He spoke about wifi capabilities. 16, 32, 64 gigs with or without cellular option.

Councillor Sakundiak asked the cost of replacing screen.

Mr. Matkowski replied that it would probably around \$250.

Councillor Sakundiak; Is it traceable?

Mr. Matkowski: If it were a 3G IPad, it probably could be.

CAO would email packages to Councillors.

Mr. Matkowski said the tablet can be set up for email.

Councillor Siggelkow asked if you could do Facebook and Twitter?

Mr. Matkowski: Yes, it would.

Councillor Siggelkow: If you wanted to use it for business, would you recommend something else?

Mr. Matkowski: Most business run on a pc with the windows program. I have an android. Androids are not as popular as IPads. To use an IPad you need an I-tunes account, which costs nothing but they will want your credit card information. Apps have to be purchased from I-tunes. Apple computers and their apps are more stable but androids can purchase apps at other places than I-tunes. Tablets can be used for business. He then talked about Windows programs and Windows laptop.

Councillor Sakundiak asked if they could put our policy handbook on it?

Councillor Sakundiak: Can it remind of items that should be followed up?

Mr. Matkowski said yes, the tablets have calendars, etc.

Councillor Sakundiak: If I had the agenda on the tablet, could I speak my commands?

Mr. Matkowski: Yes, the device is capable.

Admin. Ass't asked how long a battery could last and could they be used when they are plugged in?

Mr. Matkowski stated only hours, but would possibly last over 4 hours.

Councillor Sakundiak: If we got the tablets, can we all use only one inlet so that we don't have wires running everywhere?

Mr. Matkowski replied that yes, they could be run through a single inlet.

Public Works Superintendent asked about security features.

Mr. Matkowski replied that codes could be required for access.

Councillor Sakundiak said his wife has Samsung android phone. She has app that she set so that it can be found and shut down if it is lost or stolen.

Mr. Matkowski said yes, this model could do that but an android probably wouldn't be capable of being tracked down if it were stolen.

CAO asked if emails are on another computer, can they be deleted from any of your devices?

Mr. Matkowski replied all of your email accounts could be 'married' and be controlled from any of your electronic devices, such as smart phones or computers.

Councillor Sakundiak: Is it possible if get emails from own email account and can they be hacked?

Mr. Matkowski replied that it can be hacked.

Councillor Cooke asked if you already have an I-tunes account, you can use it?

Mr. Matkowski said yes. He also stated that the \$100 cheaper tablet would probably work well for Council.
