Constable Jason Seper, Constable in charge of rural members

Constable Seper stated that he does not attend Council as often as he maybe should because things go so smoothly in Sexsmith. He presented a statistical summary. Break and enters are related to the drug trade. During the evenings, rural have six staff working from Crooked Creek to the B. C. border to the Kakwa road to half-way past the Webster Road.

They are still short on manpower. The County funds three positions, too, and they are a corporal and two constables. He has a full compliment now but could still use more members.

The Town needs to have victims call Jason or ask for the supervisor to inquire about cases that are not followed up. They supervise twenty-eight members. Members need to followup. New members will be encouraged to follow up with complainants. They will be going to a new radio system, perhaps within a year.

For COPS, they should send in a copy of their reports of questionable occurrences.

Mr. Gordey asked about quads.

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Constable Seper said they are low priority. Their hands are tied and they are quite ineffective with quads.

Councillor Barnfield thanked the RCMP for their response to COPS. They have been very quick to respond.

They have eight different retro cars throughout the province and they are functional police cars. They are getting two Harley Davidson motorcycles. Constable Seper thinks a Town constable is a good thing, if the Town can afford it.
