DELEGATION Carrie Hogg and Elizabeth Bell, South Peace Rural Community Learning

Carrie Hogg reported that the SPRCL rural component encompasses 6,000 sq. km. outside of the City of Grande Prairie. They offer classes such as first aid, food safety, and computer training in each community three times a year. English language classes for adults are offered. Rural Reading Network is looking for two tutors to work with adults. Their main office is located in Beaverlodge.

Elizabeth Bell is in charge of the Faimily Literacy program, through which literacy is offered to children from 0 - 6 years old and adults in the family are encouraged to participate in not just reading, but also activities with the family. In March, Beyond the Book will offer free books, crafts, songs, rhymes and snacks. Baby Books and More develops learning skills in children from 0 - 6 years. The First Steps Program is for new English learners and uses rhymes and patterns to teach families to read. The SPRCL would like to do presentations and get information from schools. Their services are free and are funded by the Alberta government (Alberta Advanced Education). The programs run four, six, or eight weeks.

Councillor Skjaveland asked about rentals at the Civic Centre? They do rent the Legion room.

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CAO asked if they work social programs with immigrants? They teach English. Literacy is more than just reading. They develop partnerships with libraries, and FCSS for space and they do the programs.
